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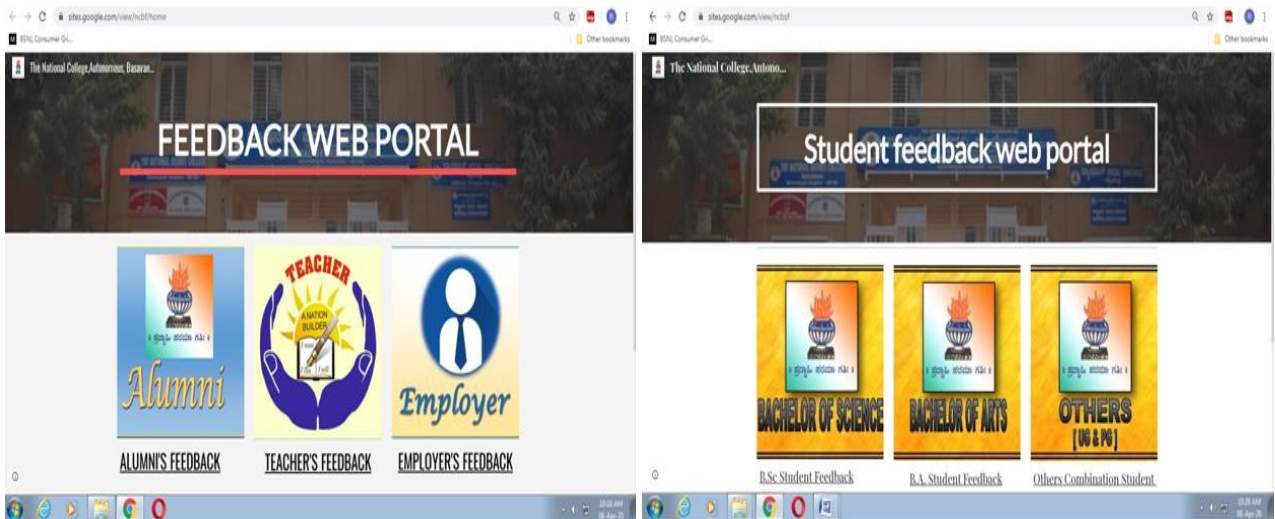

The Students' Feedback on curriculum at The National College-Autonomous, Basavanagudi, Bengaluru campus is designed to get decisive feedback from students that can be used towards the improvements in the quality of curriculum design. Students' feedback is sought from around 424 students about the curriculum for the academic year 2019-2020. The students have given their responses for the following Questionnaire:

1	4.35	A discussion with respective teachers regarding strategies for further improvement is planned.
2	4.32	The Principal, along with the representatives, suggested that pedagogical method could be improvised.
3	4.35	The syllabus has to accommodate more skills for the learners; it is agreed that in the classroom more hands-on activities are to be planned.
4	4.38	The faculty members are advised to provide scholarly articles as support materials in order to simulate their interest in the subjects as well as to enhance creative output.
5	4.45	It was observed that most of the topics are relatable. However, a suggestion to the faculty members is made on introducing innovative methods to enhance the inherent quality of this aspect of the syllabus.
6	4.50	Most learners agree that the assignments are relevant and support a better understanding of the syllabus. It is suggested to the faculty that classroom presentations could also be considered as a part of

		the assessment.
7	4.48	The teaching staff was informed about this feedback and was asked to frame the assignments to enhance conceptual learning.
8	4.51	Most of the stakeholders agreed that the tests challenged their understanding and learning. It was decided to ensure that the high standards of the question papers are maintained.
9	4.48	BOS meetings have always supported and insisted that the departments upgrade the laboratory equipment to enhance experiential learning. It is also suggested to the departments to check if further upgrading of the lab is required.
10	4.48	The college library is one of the most well equipped libraries with exhaustive books and journals. Library also gives internet access to fetch in most of the materials. It is suggested to buy access to important journals.
11	4.44	Examination Committee plans the seating arrangements for the two internal tests. Question papers are prepared and sent to the Examination section with utmost care. Invigilators ensure to prevent any instance of malpractice. It was decided to convene a meeting with the Controller of Examination to find out if any other measure to conduct fair examination is possible.
12	4.45	It is decided to encourage learners to make presentations creatively viz PPTs, Charts as well as Oral presentations. Learners' participation is a part of continuous assessment of the learners.
13	4.34	In order to create learner centric classroom, it is agreed that learners are to be given more freedom to participate in discussions in the classroom, to encourage learners to make their presentations through models especially in the Science departments; Humanities departments agreed to encourage field studies, to organize survey and present the reports in the classroom as part of learning.
14	4.48	The feedback depicts that the learners are satisfied.
15	4.40	The stakeholders' response depicts that they agree that the syllabus is contemporary and the pedagogical methods employed encourages them to take up higher studies.
16	4.38	The Action Committee has decided to take steps to augment Research opportunities. Most departments have incorporated research methods as a part of the syllabus. This imparts research aptitude as well as encourages the learner to take up research.
17	4.33	Employability skills are revised in the syllabus framework. The BOS has a represented Industry

		expert targeting to do the same.
18	4.25	Various measure are taken to ensure this viz guest lectures by respective experts in the discipline, exposure to most recent discussions through research articles, field trips and digital skills are provided to the learners to ensure skill acquisition to participate in the global space.

Alumni Feedback-Action Taken Report:

The contribution of alumni to the activities of the University is substantial especially in the development of the curriculum. Nearly 346 alumni were given their feedback for the following Questionnaire:

Teachers' Feedback- Action Taken Report:

Feedback on various aspects of curriculum is sought from 194 faculty members of our college and various other colleges. The aspects such as provision of adequate time and resources for framing syllabus, coverage of both theoretical and practical components in the syllabus, the coherence of the syllabus with Programme Outcomes, involvement of the field experts while designing the syllabus, focus on necessary technical/ teaching skills, ensuring components that inculcate ethical values, enlisting reference books, focus on flexible curriculum based on current trends, updated elective courses etc. As teachers play a pivotal role in designing and implementing the curriculum, the inputs received from their feedback was taken into consideration for further necessary action wherever applicable.
