## **Students' Feedback Report**

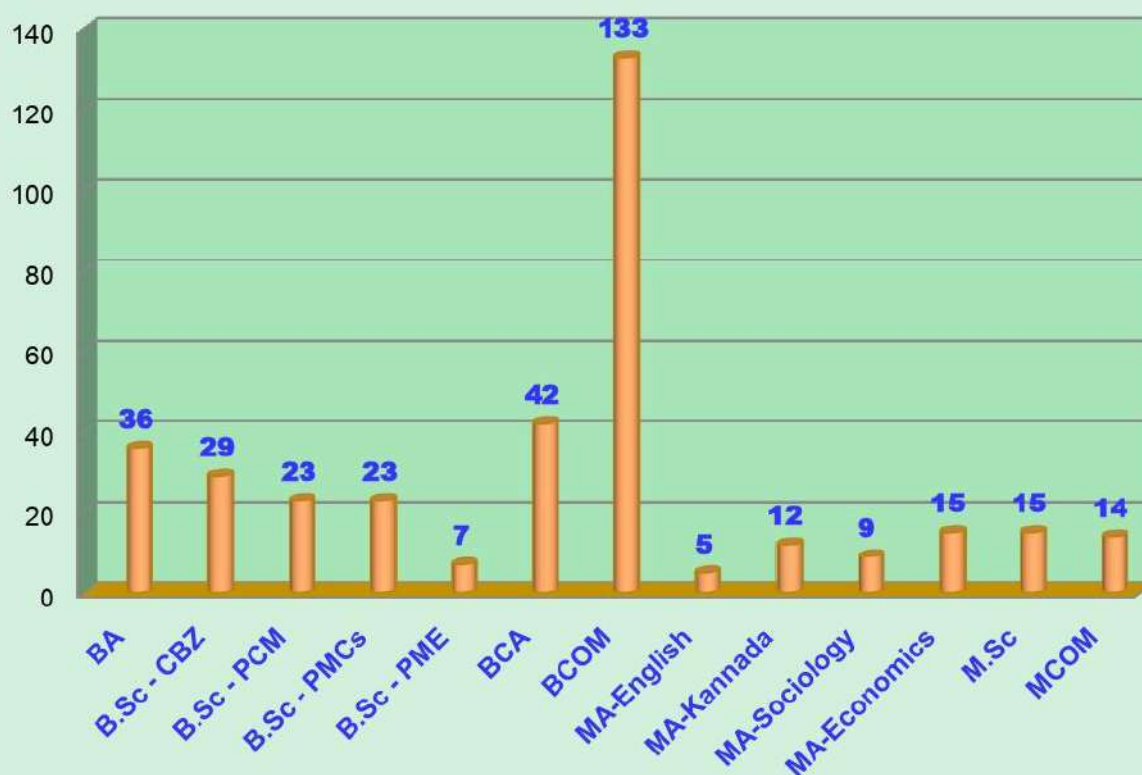

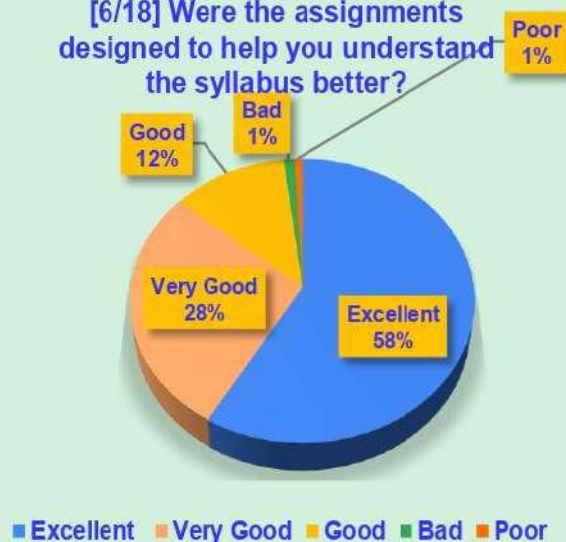

The contribution of alumni to the activities of the University is substantial especially in the development of the curriculum. Nearly 281 alumni were given their feedback for the following Questionnaire:

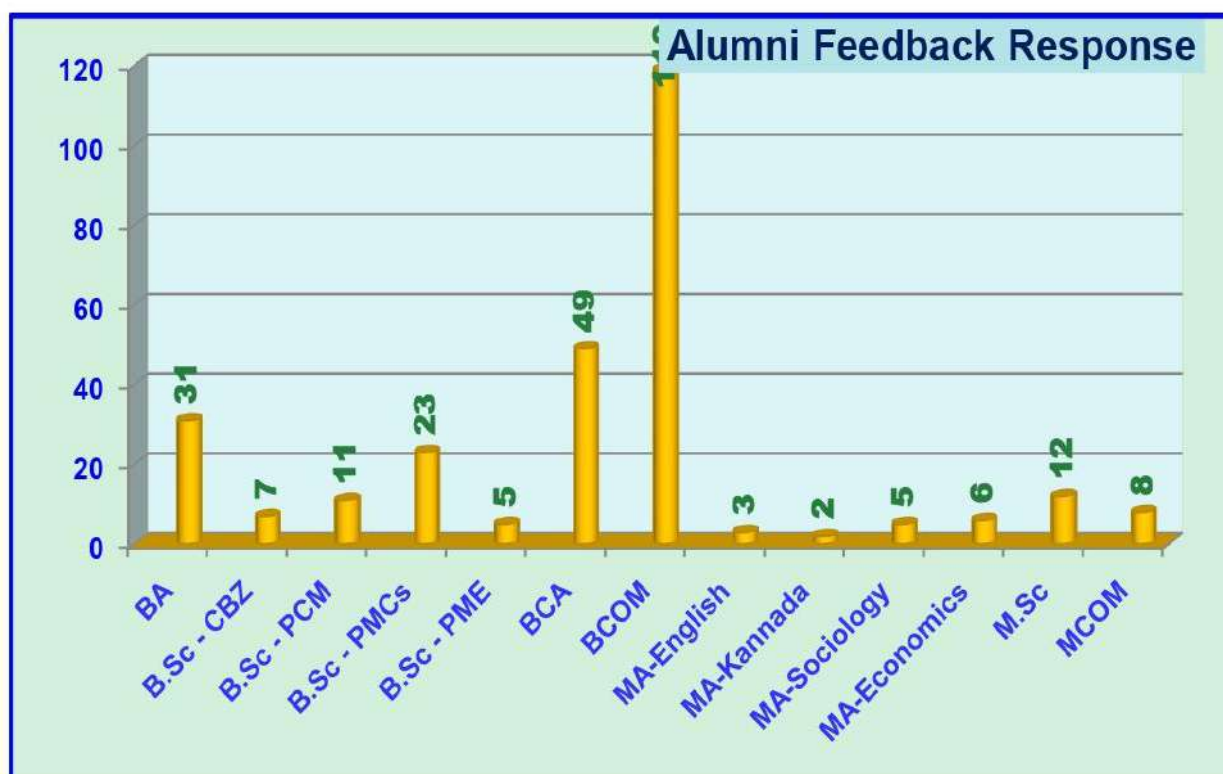

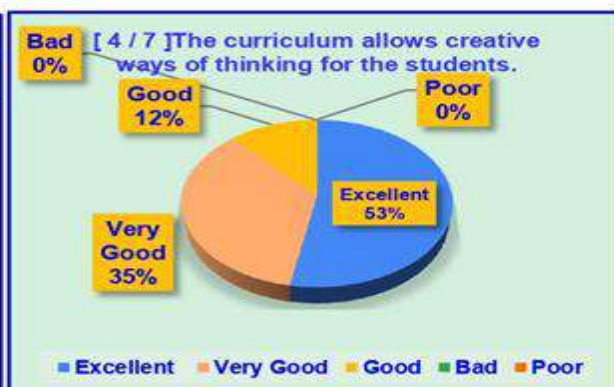
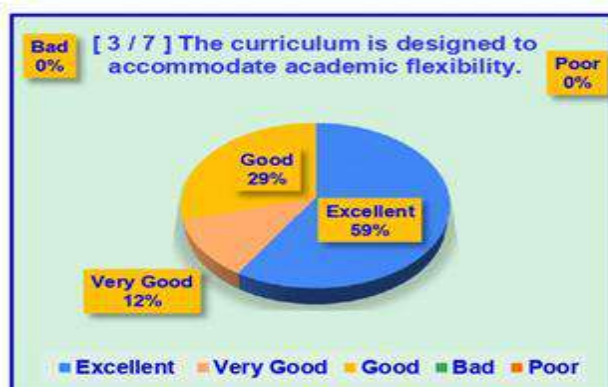
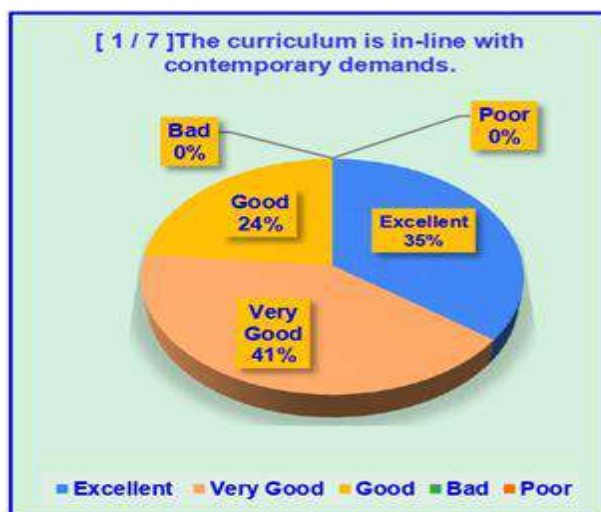
Practical appropriately. Various suggestions related to the modifications in the curricular content are noted for further necessary action.

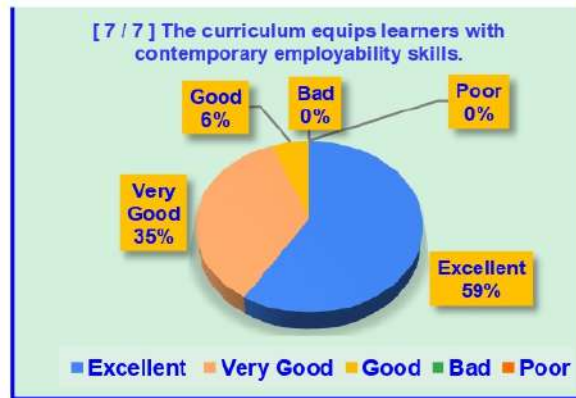
