### **PROCEEDINGS**

- The meeting commenced with a welcome address by the Principal and Chairperson of IQAC, Dr. C B Annapoornamma. She emphasized the importance of quality assurance and continuous improvement in academic and administrative activities.
- The minutes of the previous IQAC meeting were reviewed and confirmed by the members. There were no amendments to the recorded minutes.
- The committee discussed the implementation strategies for NEP 2020 and reviewed
  the existing curriculum to align it with the new policy. Emphasis was placed on
  introducing new courses that cater to current academic and industry demands.
  Members suggested incorporating interdisciplinary studies and practical applications
  in the curriculum to enhance learning outcomes.
- Prof. Krishna B Kulkarni presented an overview of upcoming faculty development initiatives. The committee proposed several workshops, seminars, and training sessions aimed at enhancing teaching skills and staying updated with the latest

- educational trends. The importance of continuous professional development for faculty members was stressed.
- Prof. P L Ramesh presented plans for student skill enhancement, including workshops, internships, and exchange programs. The committee highlighted the need for holistic development programs that not only focus on academics but also on soft skills and industry readiness. Potential partnerships with industries for student internships were considered.
- The need for upgrading academic and non-academic facilities was acknowledged by the committee members. Proposals included the implementation of new technologies in classrooms and labs, improving library resources, and enhancing campus infrastructure to support a conducive learning environment.
- The committee set targets for the academic year, focusing on improving teaching methods, student performance, and administrative efficiency. Metrics for performance evaluation were established to monitor progress and ensure accountability. Regular feedback from students and faculty was considered crucial for continuous improvement.
- The floor was opened for additional points of discussion. Members brought up the need for better alumni engagement and suggested organizing events to leverage alumni expertise and support.
- Prof. Ravi Hegde summarized the key points and action items from the meeting. The next meeting date was confirmed, and members were encouraged to follow through on the discussed initiatives.

### ACTION TAKEN REPORT

- The Academic Calendar for the academic year 2022-2023 was discussed, finalized, and approved. The calendar was distributed to all departments for implementation.
- The curriculum was reviewed and updated to align with NEP 2020 guidelines. New interdisciplinary courses were introduced to meet current academic and industry demands. Practical application components were integrated into the curriculum.
- Several faculty development initiatives were planned and scheduled, including workshops, seminars, and training sessions. These initiatives focus on enhancing teaching skills and incorporating the latest educational trends.
- Conducted a thorough analysis of feedback received from parents, students, and faculty regarding various aspects of academic programs and activities.
- Implemented key recommendations derived from the feedback to enhance the quality
  of educational experiences and support services. Communicated findings from the
  feedback analysis to relevant stakeholders, fostering transparency and collaboration in
  ongoing improvement efforts.
- Initiated targeted improvement initiatives based on specific feedback themes to address identified areas of concern and enhance overall educational outcomes.
