Minutes:

The IQAC Meeting for the academic year 2023-2024 at The National College Basavanagudi was convened on September 13, 2023. The meeting began with a warm welcome from the Principal, who emphasized the importance of planning the entire academic year. Dr. Binoy V.V, the Academic Representative from the National Institute of Advanced Studies, was introduced during the opening remarks. The IQAC Coordinator provided an overview of the proceedings from the previous year's meeting, discussed the activities conducted in 2023, and presented the agendas for upcoming programs, which were already scheduled in the academic calendar.

Throughout the meeting, a wide range of topics were discussed and deliberated upon. Under the umbrella of academic development, a focus on skill development for students was highlighted, particularly in the Robotics and AI domain. Management suggested establishing an MOU for an Animation diploma. There was a collective drive to track students who secured job offers through placements and to investigate why some did not. The idea of integrating job-oriented skill development within the regular timetable, in partnership with the Karnataka State Skill Development Corporation, was proposed. The importance of conducting webinars to enrich students' knowledge was stressed by Sri. Arun Kumar.

NAAC updates, including faculty exchange programs, were presented by Prof. Ravi Hegde. The notion of creating a cluster involving National College and neighboring institutions under the management's purview was suggested by Dr. Binoy. The exchange of best practices encompassed a sustainable approach, such as donating books for students and using recycled papers. Initiating an Intellectual Property Rights cell to conduct workshops and seminars for students and renewing the waste management MOU, including e-waste management and a collection centre for students, were also proposed.

Infrastructure development was a key area of focus, with plans in place for a ladies' hostel, renovation of existing boys' hostels, and classroom upgrades. Dr. Binoy recommended the introduction of a Kannada Cell. Green initiatives were emphasized, including Green Audit, Electrical Audit, rainwater harvesting, and maximizing the use of solar panels. A unique suggestion was to create a vertical garden with indigenous species.

Academic audit by a third party was discussed, along with the initiation of lesson plans and teaching plans in all departments. Plans to revamp the alumni association and make it compulsory for 6th-semester students to enroll in alumni activities were outlined. The IQAC room is set to undergo restructuring, with added computer facilities and criteria-based divisions.

Regarding research and teaching, Dr. Binoy proposed focusing on the college's strengths, optimizing workload management, and utilizing seed money effectively. A comprehensive research plan, fostering connections with startups, and a five-year action plan were also on the agenda. The meeting explored the possibility of conducting Olympiads and providing the necessary infrastructure for such events.

D. Jayanth Vyasanakere, an alumnus of the college, offered a series of valuable suggestions during the meeting. Firstly, he recommended introducing open electives that would be common for both the second and third-year students thereby providing students with a broader array of choices and enhancing their learning experience, with a dedicated common period allocated for open elective classes. Additionally, Mr. Vyasanakere suggested the modernization of conventional laboratories to foster exploration and hands-on learning. He emphasized the importance of incorporating internships into the curriculum as an essential experiential component. Furthermore, he proposed establishing Memorandums of Understanding (MOUs) with various institutions to broaden collaborative opportunities.

For faculty development programs, he recommended considering the Indian Academy of Sciences as a potential partner, highlighting the college's capacity to host such programs. Mr. Vyasanakere also suggested exploring the possibility of establishing an examination centre for Olympiad exams, opening up a new avenue for students. Lastly, he addressed the demand for introducing a 4-year Integrated B.Ed course, emphasising the need for its incorporation. Furthermore, he encouraged the college to contemplate unique aspects that could be introduced into the degree courses to enhance their distinctiveness. These suggestions represent an invaluable contribution to the college's continuous growth and improvement.

The inclusion of PU students in AI and Robotics courses and enabling library book lending during examination preparation were suggested by UG student representatives. Both UG and PG representatives suggested the need for projectors in classrooms, expanding job fair opportunities for PG students, offering NET/KSET coaching as part of the curriculum, introducing a visiting doctor service on campus, and incorporating certificate and short-term courses.

The Controller of Examination provided important details regarding upcoming exams, result announcement dates, and actions taken against malpractices.

In conclusion, the first IQAC Meeting for the academic year 2023-2024 at The National College Basavanagudi was characterised by robust discussions and a commitment to implement a wide array of initiatives focused on academic development and student welfare. The comprehensive plan outlined during this meeting reflects the institution's dedication to fostering a conducive and enriching learning environment.
